“Stage Sprouts” (k-2nd grade)

In these sessions we will learn to:

- Use our imaginations to create characters and stories.
- Use our voices to speak clearly, loudly, softly, and with expression.
- Use our bodies to show ideas, actions, and feelings.
- Act out stories with a beginning, middle, and end.
- Move safely in the stage space and respect personal space.
- Be brave and try new things in a supportive environment.
- Have fun while learning theater skills!



“Rising Stars” (3rd - 5th grade)

In these sessions we will learn to:

- Use our bodies and movement to create believable characters.
- Express emotions and ideas through acting choices.
- Create characters using imagination and observation.
- Work as an ensemble, cooperating and supporting one another.
- Focus, listen, and respond during theater games and scenes.
- Understand basic stage directions and stage space.
- Use our voices with volume, clarity, and expression.
- Improvise scenes using ideas, characters, and teamwork.
- Memorize and perform short scenes or scripts.
- Give and receive kind, helpful feedback.
- Build confidence and take creative risks in a safe environment.

No previous theater experience is required. This class is perfect for students who enjoy storytelling, performing, or want a safe space to build self-confidence and presentation skills. The goal is for students to have fun, try new things, and develop a love for theater while learning skills that support communication and collaboration both on and off the stage.
